

Students are required to complete a Senior Project as specified in the Senior Project Guide that will be distributed to seniors. The purpose of the project, which may include research, writing, or some other form of demonstration, is to assure that the student is able to apply, analyze, synthesize and evaluate information and communicate significant knowledge and understanding. At South Side, students will be introduced to this project in the tenth grade as they develop portfolios. Juniors can obtain permission to begin their Senior Project in the summer after their Junior year. The Senior Project is composed of three segments. The first component involves an oral presentation summarizing the activities included in the student's 30 hours of an approved community/volunteer service, or experiences related to the student's career. Secondly, the student must submit a three to five page typed report summarizing the experience and a signed time log verifying the hours volunteered. The third segment includes the submission of a portfolio. Specific guidelines related to each of these components will be outlined for each student during the spring of the student's Junior year. Generally, Seniors must have these three components completed by April of the senior year. Seniors who fulfill course requirements but who do not complete a Senior Project will not graduate.
